



Call for Summer School applications for the joint meeting of SIG 8 & SIG 16

One of our proud traditions is the organization of the ICM Summer School, which takes place prior to our biannual SIG conference. This year, the summer school is jointly organized by the local organizing committee at TU Dresden, by EARLI SIG8 (Motivation & Emotion), and by EARLI SIG16 (Metacognition). The Summer School will take place between August 31st - September 2nd, 2020 in beautiful Moritzburg (<u>https://www.kulturlandschaft-moritzburg.de/</u>) near Dresden, Germany, and we are excited to invite applications from both SIGs!

The joint summer school provides junior researchers who are members of SIG8 and/or SIG16 with the opportunity to interact with and learn from leading experts in the fields of motivation, emotion, and metacognition research, to meet with other graduate students from across the globe who are interested in similar topics, to discuss their own dissertation projects in the summer school sessions, and to establish and expand their international professional networks. This year, the participating students also have the unique opportunity to interact with experts across both SIG8 8 and 16!

Who can apply?

- You are currently a graduate student working towards a PhD, and you will not have obtained your degree by the time you attend the summer school in 2020.
- \circ You are a (junior) member of SIG8 or SIG16 at the time of application.
- You have a dissertation project that you are able to present in the summer school; dissertation projects across <u>all stages</u> of the research process are eligible – from the early stages of conceptualizing your research to more advanced stages.

How can you apply?

The submission system will open on **January 07, 2020**. Please submit your application **by February 07, 2020** via your EARLI dashboard at <u>https://www.earli-eapril.org/</u>. Your application should include:

- A **Title Page** including your name, institution, advisor(s), and information about your SIG membership (are you a member of SIG8 and/or SIG16, and how long have you been a member).
 - A **Summary** of your dissertation project that includes:
 - o a title

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- o an abstract of 100-250 words
- o an extended summary of 500-1000 words incl. references
- o optional: Figures and Tables that should be integrated into the summary
- Up to three **Questions** that you would like to discuss with the summer school teachers and other participants

Your project **Summary** should include the following sections:

- 1. Objectives and purpose (the objectives should be relevant for at least one of the following domains: motivation, emotion, metacognition, and/or self-regulated learning)
- 2. Theoretical framework, conceptual rationale, (if applicable) research questions
- 3. (Planned) Research methods and design (for empirical contributions) or embeddedness in the relevant literature (for theoretical contributions)
- 4. If applicable: Results and/or substantiated conclusions
- 5. Significance for theory, policy, practice (for empirical contributions) or theoretical debates (for theoretical contributions)
